Growth spurs GalaxE Solutions Inc. to expand Detroit presence

New Jersey-based information technology company **GalaxE Solutions Inc.** is expanding its Detroit presence and taking a larger lease at the 1001 Woodward building.

The company in May signed a 28,000-square-foot lease in the Campus Martius building and is now expanding the size to 40,000 square feet. The expansion comes as GalaxE CEO Tim Bryan said hiring has gone faster than expected.

"Our vision of Detroit as a hub for the creation of leading edge, custom IT solutions is resonating with our customers across the country," said Bryan in a press release.

"Their interest in work being conducted in Campus Martius is validating our model of providing a viable alternative to sending work overseas."

Driven by new client contracts to develop healthcare IT work in Detroit, GalaxE's plans to hire 500 IT professionals over the next 5 years in the city is ahead of schedule, necessitating the need for more space.

Within the first four months of occupancy, 38 new employees have been hired with an additional 120 positions to be filled, putting GalaxE well ahead of its first year hiring targets.

The lease will move occupancy in the building slightly above the previous 25-percent figure.

The building is owned by Detroit entrepreneur Dimitrios "Jim" Papas.
